Argumentation & Debate: *The basic principles of argumentation as they are put into practice via oral communication. Students learn the reasoning process using tools of critical thinking including the basic model of argument, how to construct valid arguments and recognize logical fallacies, and how to deliver those oral arguments effectively. Students learn how to construct a debate case and how to present the case in the context of an academic debate.*

Intercultural Communication Competence: *Investigates theories and concepts related to the intersections between culture, ethnicity, race, identity, and human interaction. Students explore how cultural nuances, stereotypes, prejudices, and misperceptions lead to miscommunication, and will focus on differences and similarities between cultures and positive outcomes that may emerge from intercultural interactions. Also examines how differences based on sexual orientation, age, religion, disability, and gender can function as inter/cultural communication between people.*
