*The objective of the Scholarly Writing course is to help you become a better writer of scholarly manuscripts. To help you reach this objective, you will learn how (1) to develop your critical “eye” for recognizing quality (and problems) in the scholarly work of others, (2) to use particular formulas that guide scholarly writing, and (3) to develop your skills of analysis, evaluation, induction, deduction, classification, synthesis, abstraction, and persuasive expression. Students who enroll in the seminar should have at least a rough draft of a project (convention paper, proposal, thesis, etc.) and the willingness to work on improving this draft throughout the quarter.*
