**Description for COMM 594IR (International Relations) with Dr. Michael Stohl:**

This seminar will explore the nature, role and influence of globalization and technology on communication and international relations. To do so we will examine how these impact the media, the audience and policymakers. We begin by considering the context in which this communication occurs and how this has changed over time with particular reference to globalization and technology. Next, we will examine how these communication changes have altered media manifestations in terms of both time and space and how these have affected the conduct and understanding of international relations. We will then examine the processes of diplomacy as well as the actors in the making of policy and explore public diplomacy by states and citizen diplomacy. Finally, we will explore one of the most negative aspects of communication and globalization, i.e. terrorism.
